Copyright release for YANG modules: Users may freely reproduce the YANG modules contained under /experimental/ieee/ so that they can be used for their intended purpose.

- | (2) The "standard/ieee" directory is intended for approved PARs, for drafts as well as published standards.

 - | (3) Within the standard/ieee/draft directory or the standard/ieee/published directory, use a sub-directory name with the number of the IEEE Working Group (e.g. "802.1", "1588").
