### **Email Address**

The issue is that there is what the standards say and what is done USUALLY in practice. If you don't care about the details jump to <Bottom Line>.

RFC 5321 states that the "local-part" (which means the part before the "@" MUST BE treated as case sensitive. RFC 1035 talks about the domain part (the part after the "@" and that part is case-insensitive.

The issue is that many providers (the most obvious example is Google/GMAIL), ignore case when dealing with the local-part. For example: my gmail address is: scott.mansfield@gmail.com Because gmail is so lax, all of the following are considered equivalent.... s.c.o.t.t.m.a.n.s.f.i.e.l.d@gmail.com scottmansfield@gmail.com ScottMansfield@gmail.com Scott.....MaNSfiElD@gmail.com

We should determine what case the local-part has as it was defined when the email address/reflector was setup. The case of the domain part doesn't matter to the standard, so I would suggest we use whatever case was used for the local-part for the domain part. <Bottom Line>

I agree we should be consistent everywhere and should make sure the email addresses used for IEEE addresses in MIBs and YANG use the agreed format. If the name really is STDS-802-1-L then STDS-802-1-L@IEEE.ORG looks right to me. I like this guideline, because if we ever have international characters, it would be good to enforce that we use the email addresses EXACTLY as formatted when the email/reflector was created to avoid confusion. A caveat (or at least something to be aware of, continues below)...

What is frustrating is that there isn't even consistency in the way the IEEE reflectors work. For example I send an email to: STDS-802-YANG@LISTSERV.IEEE.ORG STDS-802-YANG@listserv.ieee.org and the email comes to me from the reflector the header says stds-802-yang@LISTSERV.IEEE.ORG; on behalf of; Scott Mansfield, which indicates the case sensitivity is being lost (at least) when the reflector sets the "Return-Path".

### **Instructions for the WG Chair**

### The IEEE-SA strongly recommends that at each WG meeting the chair or a designee:

- Show slides #1 through #4 of this presentation
- Advise the WG attendees that:
  - IEEE's patent policy is described in Clause 6 of the *IEEE-SA Standards Board Bylaws*;
  - Early identification of patent claims which may be essential for the use of standards under development is strongly encouraged;
  - There may be Essential Patent Claims of which IEEE is not aware. Additionally, neither IEEE, the WG, nor the WG Chair can ensure the accuracy or completeness of any assurance or whether any such assurance is, in fact, of a Patent Claim that is essential for the use of the standard under development.

Instruct the WG Secretary to record in the minutes of the relevant WG meeting:

- That the foregoing information was provided and that slides 1 through 4 (and this slide 0, if applicable) were shown;
- That the chair or designee provided an opportunity for participants to identify patent claim(s)/patent application claim(s) and/or the holder of patent claim(s)/patent application claim(s) of which the participant is personally aware and that may be essential for the use of that standard
- Any responses that were given, specifically the patent claim(s)/patent application claim(s) and/or the holder of the patent claim(s)/patent application claim(s) that were identified (if any) and by whom.
- The WG Chair shall ensure that a request is made to any identified holders of potential essential patent claim(s) to complete and submit a Letter of Assurance.
- It is recommended that the WG Chair review the guidance in *IEEE-SA Standards Board Operations Manual* 6.3.5 and in FAQs 14 and 15 on inclusion of potential Essential Patent Claims by incorporation or by reference.

Note: **WG** includes Working Groups, Task Groups, and other standards-developing committees with a PAR approved by the IEEE-SA Standards Board.



### Participants have a duty to inform the IEEE

- Participants <u>shall</u> inform the IEEE (or cause the IEEE to be informed) of the identity of each holder of any potential Essential Patent Claims of which they are personally aware if the claims are owned or controlled by the participant or the entity the participant is from, employed by, or otherwise represents
- Participants <u>should</u> inform the IEEE (or cause the IEEE to be informed) of the identity of any other holders of potential Essential Patent Claims

### Early identification of holders of potential Essential Patent Claims is encouraged



### Ways to inform IEEE

- Cause an LOA to be submitted to the IEEE-SA (patcom@ieee.org); or
- Provide the chair of this group with the identity of the holder(s) of any and all such claims as soon as possible; or

#### • Speak up now and respond to this Call for Potentially Essential Patents

If anyone in this meeting is personally aware of the holder of any patent claims that are potentially essential to implementation of the proposed standard(s) under consideration by this group and that are not already the subject of an Accepted Letter of Assurance, please respond at this time by providing relevant information to the WG Chair



### **Other guidelines for IEEE WG meetings**

- All IEEE-SA standards meetings shall be conducted in compliance with all applicable laws, including antitrust and competition laws.
  - Don't discuss the interpretation, validity, or essentiality of patents/patent claims.
  - Don't discuss specific license rates, terms, or conditions.
    - Relative costs of different technical approaches that include relative costs of patent licensing terms may be discussed in standards development meetings.
      - Technical considerations remain the primary focus
  - Don't discuss or engage in the fixing of product prices, allocation of customers, or division of sales markets.
  - Don't discuss the status or substance of ongoing or threatened litigation.
  - Don't be silent if inappropriate topics are discussed ... do formally object.

Participation in any IEEE 802 meeting (Sponsor, Sponsor subgroup, Working Group, Working Group, etc.) is on an individual basis




