Guidelines for IEEE-SA Meetings

- All IEEE-SA standards meetings shall be conducted in compliance with all applicable laws, including antitrust and competition laws.
- Don't discuss the interpretation, validity, or essentiality of patents/patent claims.
- Don't discuss specific license rates, terms, or conditions.
 - Relative costs, including licensing costs of essential patent claims, of different technical approaches may be discussed in standards development meetings.
 - Technical considerations remain primary focus
- Don't discuss or engage in the fixing of product prices, allocation of customers, or division of sales markets.
- Don't discuss the status or substance of ongoing or threatened litigation.
- Don't be silent if inappropriate topics are discussed... do formally object.

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Q & A from last meeting

When do the 5 C, Objectives and PAR need to be finalized?

- → 30 days prior the vote at IEEE802.3 plenary meeting the documents need to be submitted to WG
- Until the vote modifications are possible but must be documented (crossed out, color text, etc.)
- → This means:
 - We have to vote on the documents in the study group at the interim meeting in May
 - We still will continue with phone conferences until July plenary meeting
 - We can modify in July plenary meeting prior to the closing session
