

Guidelines for IEEE-SA Meetings

TALLS TALLS

- All IEEE-SA standards meetings shall be conducted in compliance with all applicable laws, including antitrust and competition laws.
- Don't discuss the interpretation, validity, or essentiality of patents/patent claims.
- Don't discuss specific license rates, terms, or conditions.
 - Relative costs, including licensing costs of essential patent claims, of different technical approaches may be discussed in standards development meetings.
 - Technical considerations remain primary focus
- Don't discuss or engage in the fixing of product prices, allocation of customers, or division of sales markets.
- Don't discuss the status or substance of ongoing or threatened litigation.
- Don't be silent if inappropriate topics are discussed... do formally object.

Participants, Patents, and Duty to Inform

All participants in this meeting have certain obligations under the IEEE-SA Patent Policy.

AND THE PROPERTY OF THE PROPER

- Participants [Note: Quoted text excerpted from IEEE-SA Standards Board Bylaws subclause 6.2]:
 - "Shall inform the IEEE (or cause the IEEE to be informed)" of the identity of each "holder of any potential Essential Patent Claims of which they are personally aware" if the claims are owned or controlled by the participant or the entity the participant is from, employed by, or otherwise represents
 - "Personal awareness" means that the participant "is personally aware that the holder may have a potential Essential Patent Claim," even if the participant is not personally aware of the specific patents or patent claims
 - "Should inform the IEEE (or cause the IEEE to be informed)" of the identity of "any other holders of such potential Essential Patent Claims" (that is, third parties that are not affiliated with the participant, with the participant's employer, or with anyone else that the participant is from or otherwise represents)
- The above does not apply if the patent claim is already the subject of an Accepted Letter of Assurance that applies to the proposed standard(s) under consideration by this group
- Early identification of holders of potential Essential Patent Claims is strongly encouraged
- No duty to perform a patent search




Overview of IEEE 802.3 Standards Process (1/5)-Study Group Phase



Overview of IEEE 802.3 Standards Process (3/5) Working Group Ballot Phase



Overview of IEEE 802.3 Standards Process (4/5)-Sponsor Ballot Phase




IEEE P802.3bm 40 Gb/s and 100 Gb/s Fiber Optic Task Force Objectives

AND THE RESIDENCE OF THE PROPERTY OF THE PROPE

- ♦ Support full-duplex operation only
- ♦ Preserve the IEEE 802.3 / Ethernet frame format utilizing the IEEE 802.3 MAC
- ♦ Preserve minimum and maximum FrameSize of current IEEE 802.3 standard
- ♦ Support a BER better than or equal to 10-12 at the MAC/PLS service interface
- ♦ Provide appropriate support for OTN
- Define re-timed 4-lane 100G PMA to PMA electrical interfaces for chip to chip and chip to module applications
- ♦ Define a 40 Gb/s PHY for operation over at least 40 km of SMF
- ♦ Define a 100 Gb/s PHY for operation up to at least 100 m of MMF
- Specify optional Energy Efficient Ethernet (EEE) for 40 Gb/s and 100 Gb/s operation over fiber optic cables.
