Instructions for the WG Chair

The IEEE-SA strongly recommends that at each WG meeting the chair or a designee:

- Show slides #1 through #4 of this presentation
- Advise the WG attendees that:
 - The IEEE's patent policy is described in Clause 6 of the *IEEE-SA Standards Board Bylaws*;
 - Early identification of patent claims which may be essential for the use of standards under development is strongly encouraged;
 - There may be Essential Patent Claims of which the IEEE is not aware. Additionally, neither the IEEE, the WG, nor the WG chair can ensure the accuracy or completeness of any assurance or whether any such assurance is, in fact, of a Patent Claim that is essential for the use of the standard under development.
- Instruct the WG Secretary to record in the minutes of the relevant WG meeting:
 - That the foregoing information was provided and that slides 1 through 4 (and this slide 0, if applicable) were shown;
 - That the chair or designee provided an opportunity for participants to identify patent claim(s)/patent application claim(s) and/or the holder of patent claim(s)/patent application claim(s) of which the participant is personally aware and that may be essential for the use of that standard
 - Any responses that were given, specifically the patent claim(s)/patent application claim(s) and/or the holder of the patent claim(s)/patent application claim(s) that were identified (if any) and by whom.
- The WG Chair shall ensure that a request is made to any identified holders of potential essential patent claim(s) to complete and submit a Letter of Assurance.
- It is recommended that the WG chair review the guidance in *IEEE-SA Standards Board Operations Manual* 6.3.5 and in FAQs 14 and 15 on inclusion of potential Essential Patent Claims by incorporation or by reference.

Note: **WG** includes Working Groups, Task Groups, and other standards-developing committees with a PAR approved by the IEEE-SA Standards Board.



Participants, Patents, and Duty to Inform

All participants in this meeting have certain obligations under the IEEE-SA Patent Policy.

- **Participants [Note: Quoted text excerpted from IEEE-SA Standards Board Bylaws subclause 6.2]:**
 - **“Shall inform the IEEE (or cause the IEEE to be informed)” of the identity of each “holder of any potential Essential Patent Claims of which they are personally aware” if the claims are owned or controlled by the participant or the entity the participant is from, employed by, or otherwise represents**
 - **“Should inform the IEEE (or cause the IEEE to be informed)” of the identity of “any other holders of potential Essential Patent Claims” (that is, third parties that are not affiliated with the participant, with the participant’s employer, or with anyone else that the participant is from or otherwise represents)**
- **The above does not apply if the patent claim is already the subject of an Accepted Letter of Assurance that applies to the proposed standard(s) under consideration by this group**
- **Early identification of holders of potential Essential Patent Claims is strongly encouraged**
- **No duty to perform a patent search**

Call for Potentially Essential Patents

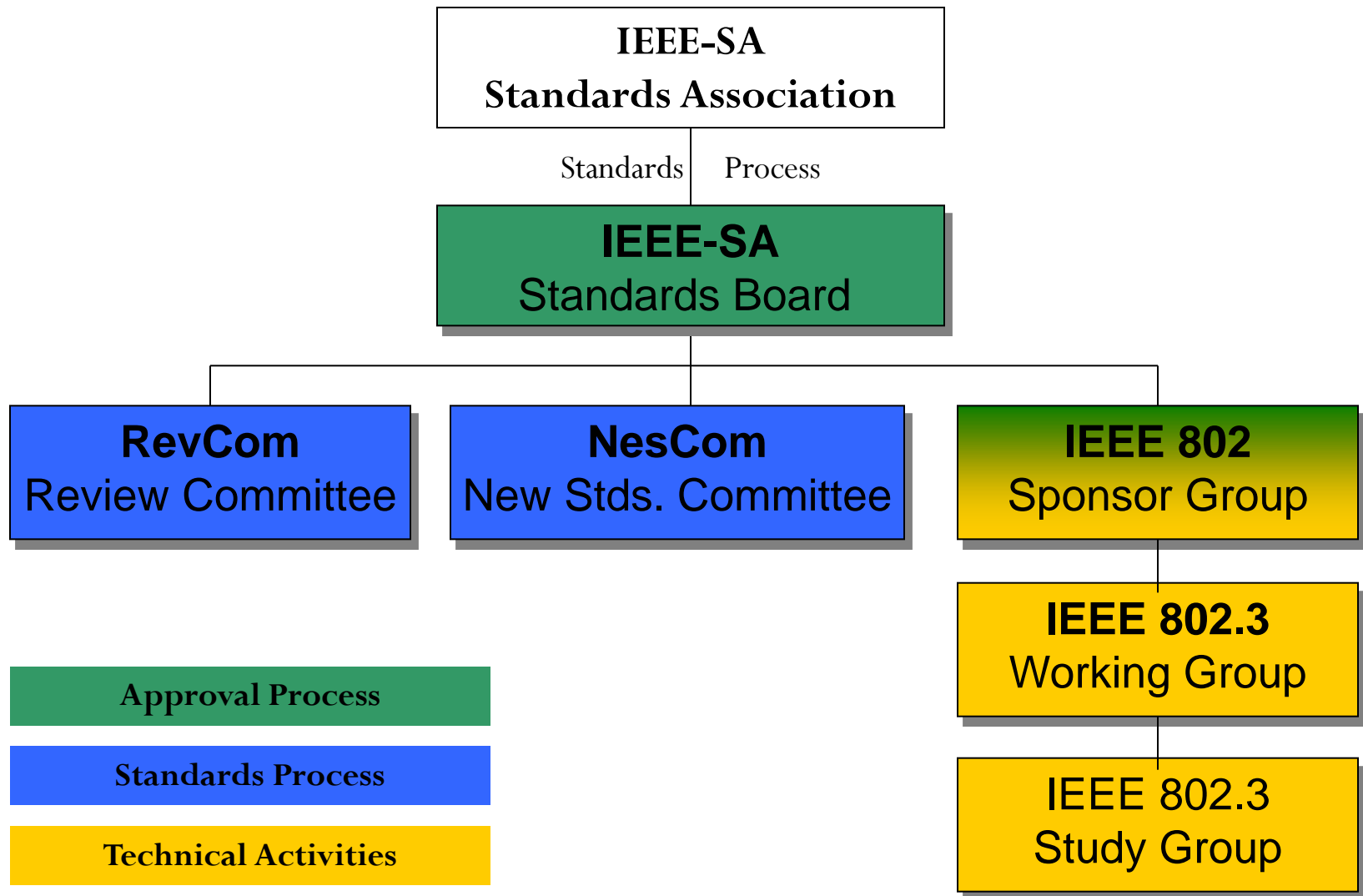
- If anyone in this meeting is personally aware of the holder of any patent claims that are potentially essential to implementation of the proposed standard(s) under consideration by this group and that are not already the subject of an Accepted Letter of Assurance:
 - Either speak up now or
 - Provide the chair of this group with the identity of the holder(s) of any and all such claims as soon as possible or
 - Cause an LOA to be submitted

Other Guidelines for IEEE WG Meetings

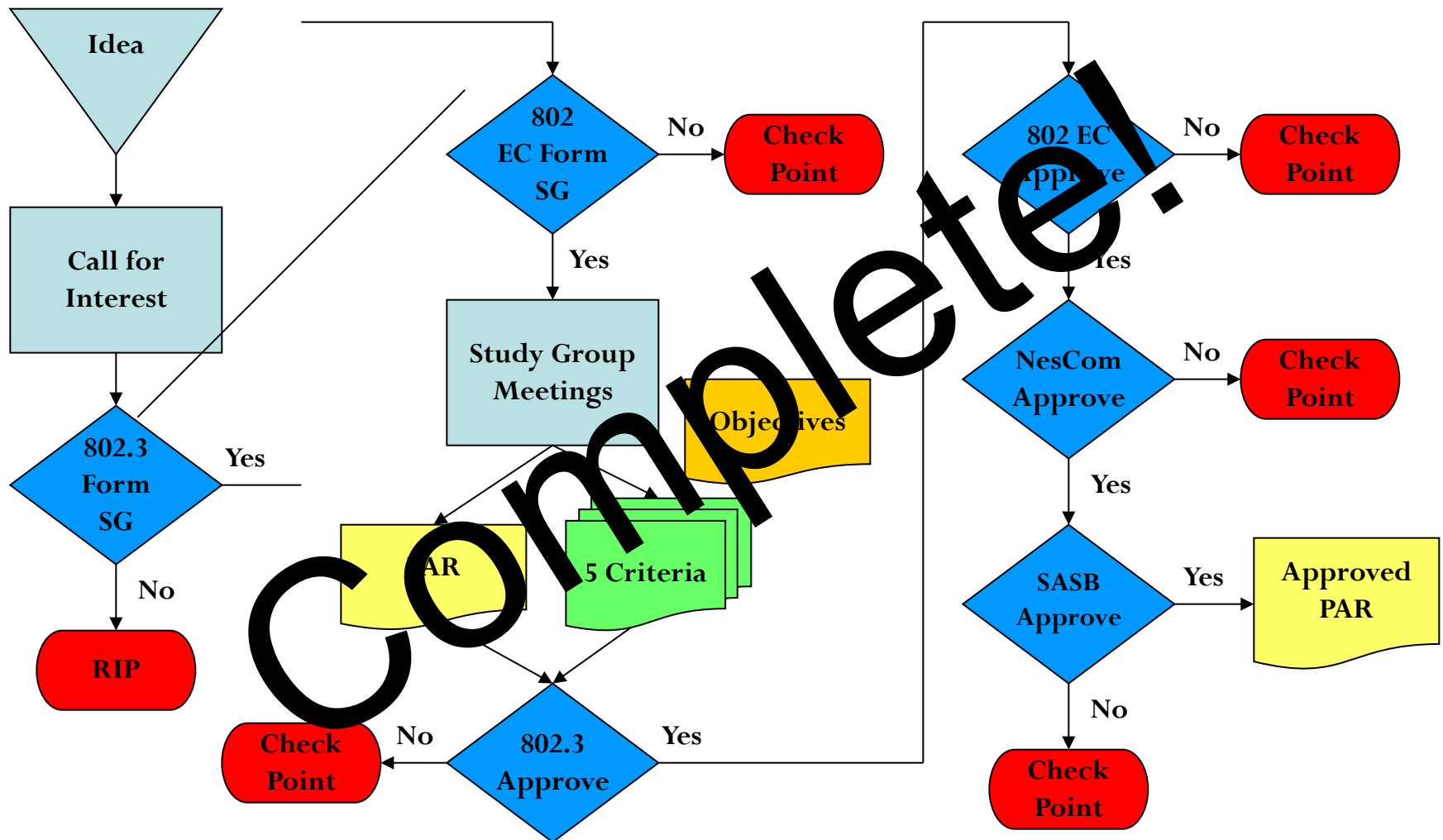
- **All IEEE-SA standards meetings shall be conducted in compliance with all applicable laws, including antitrust and competition laws.**
 - **Don't discuss the interpretation, validity, or essentiality of patents/patent claims.**
 - **Don't discuss specific license rates, terms, or conditions.**
 - Relative costs, including licensing costs of essential patent claims, of different technical approaches may be discussed in standards development meetings.
 - Technical considerations remain primary focus
 - **Don't discuss or engage in the fixing of product prices, allocation of customers, or division of sales markets.**
 - **Don't discuss the status or substance of ongoing or threatened litigation.**
 - **Don't be silent if inappropriate topics are discussed ... do formally object.**

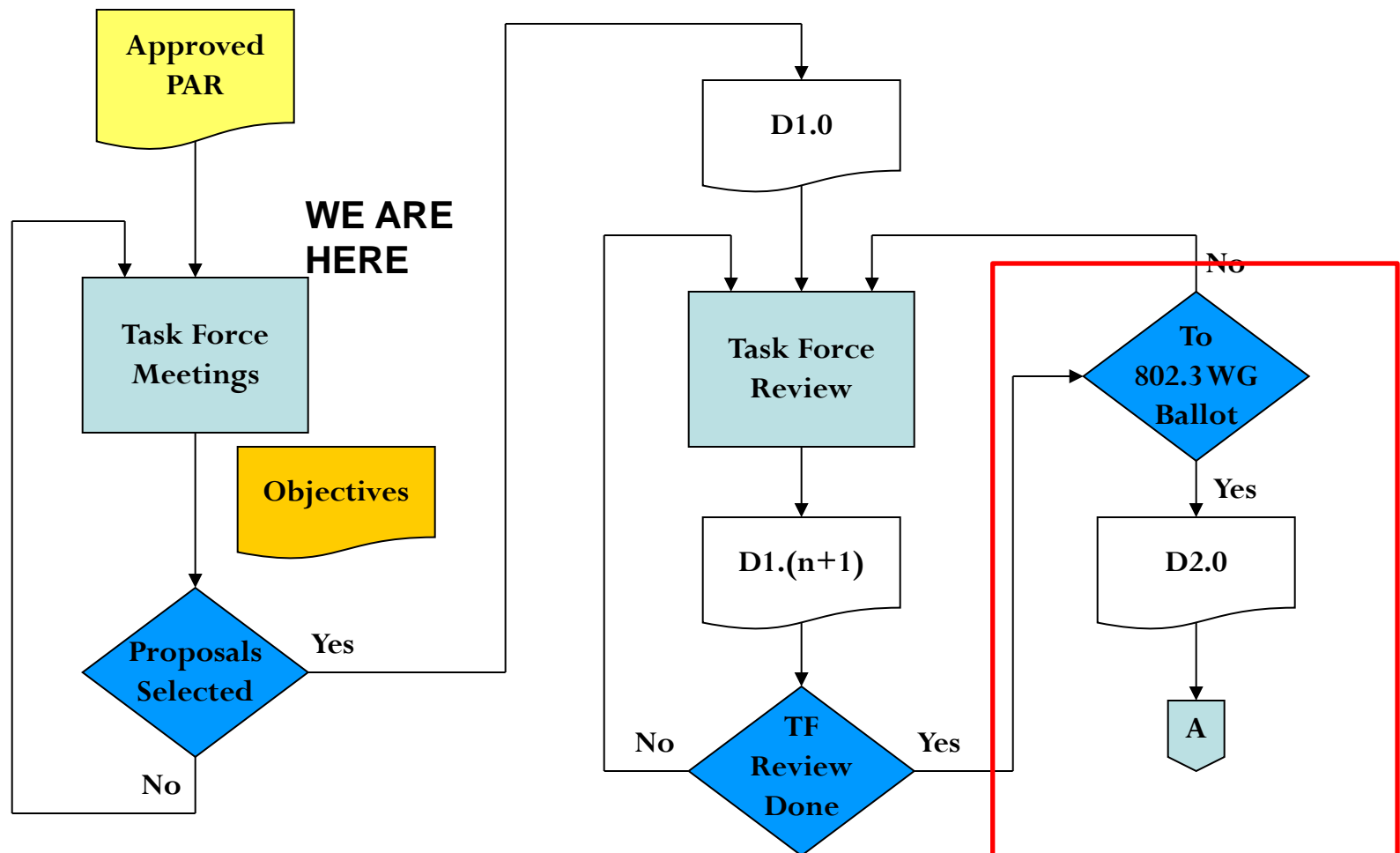


Overview of IEEE 802.3 Standards Process (1/5)- Study Group Phase

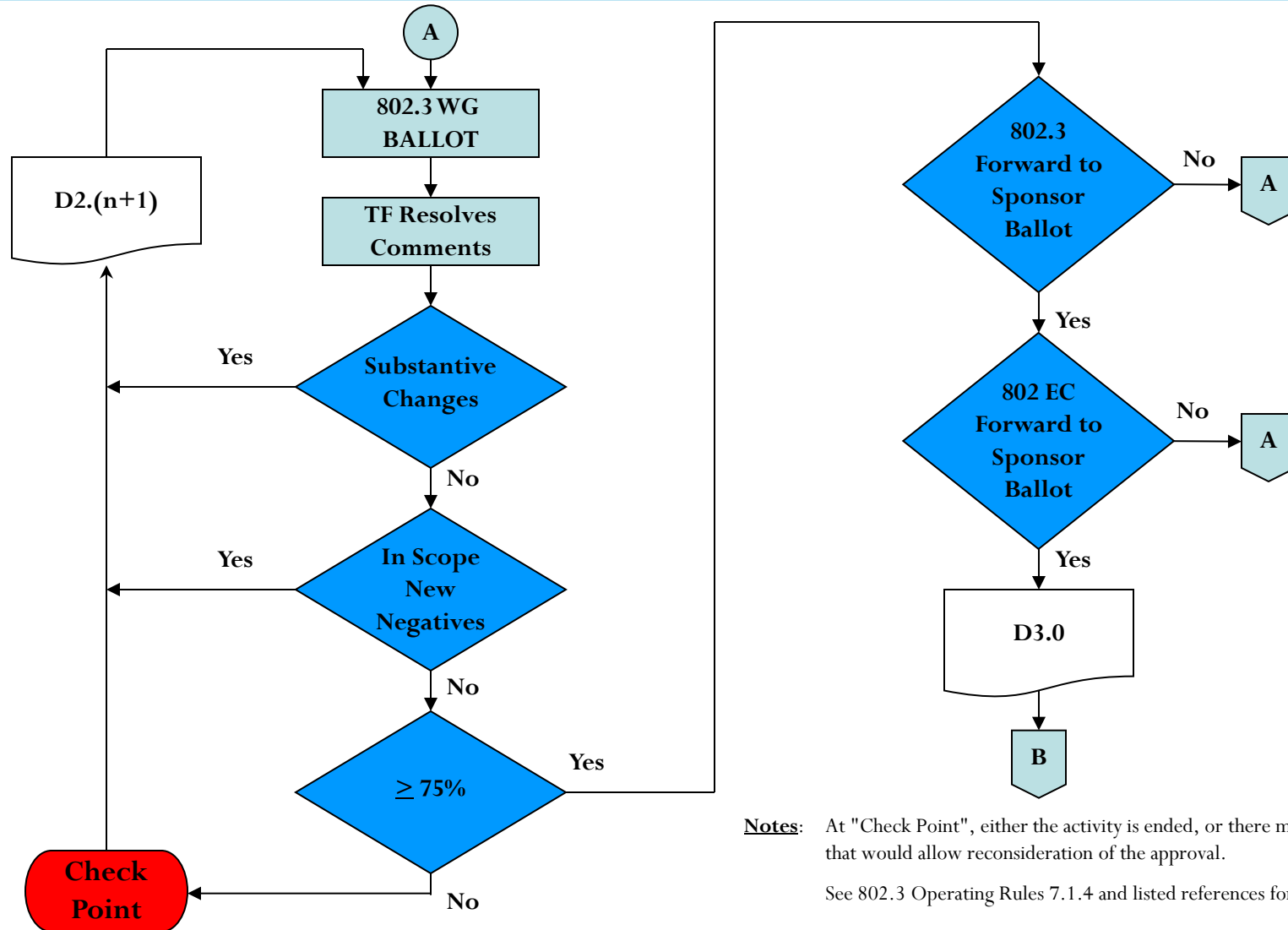

Overview of IEEE 802.3 Standards Process (2/5) – Task Force Comment Phase



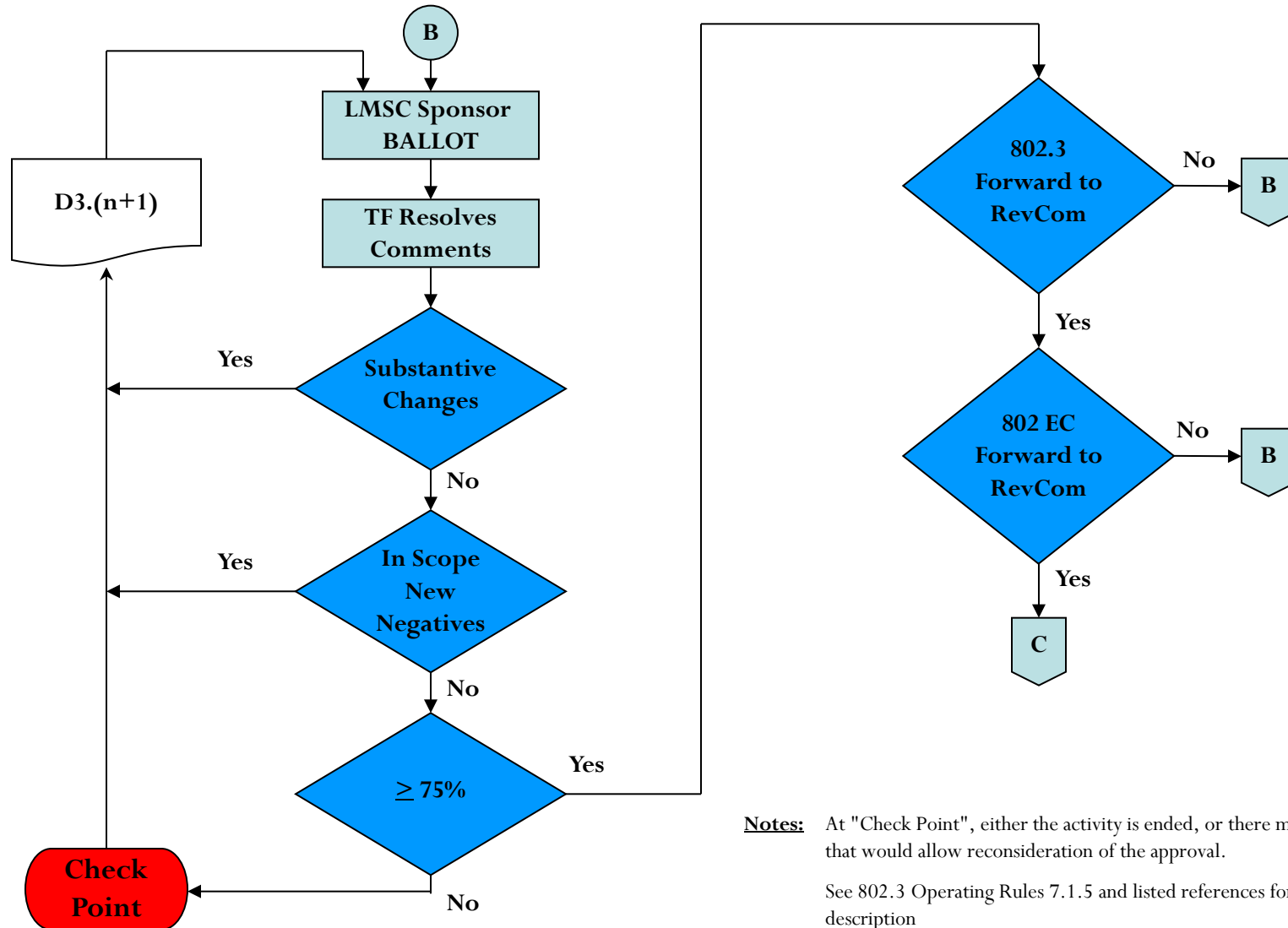
Overview of IEEE 802.3 Standards Process (3/5) – Working Group Ballot Phase

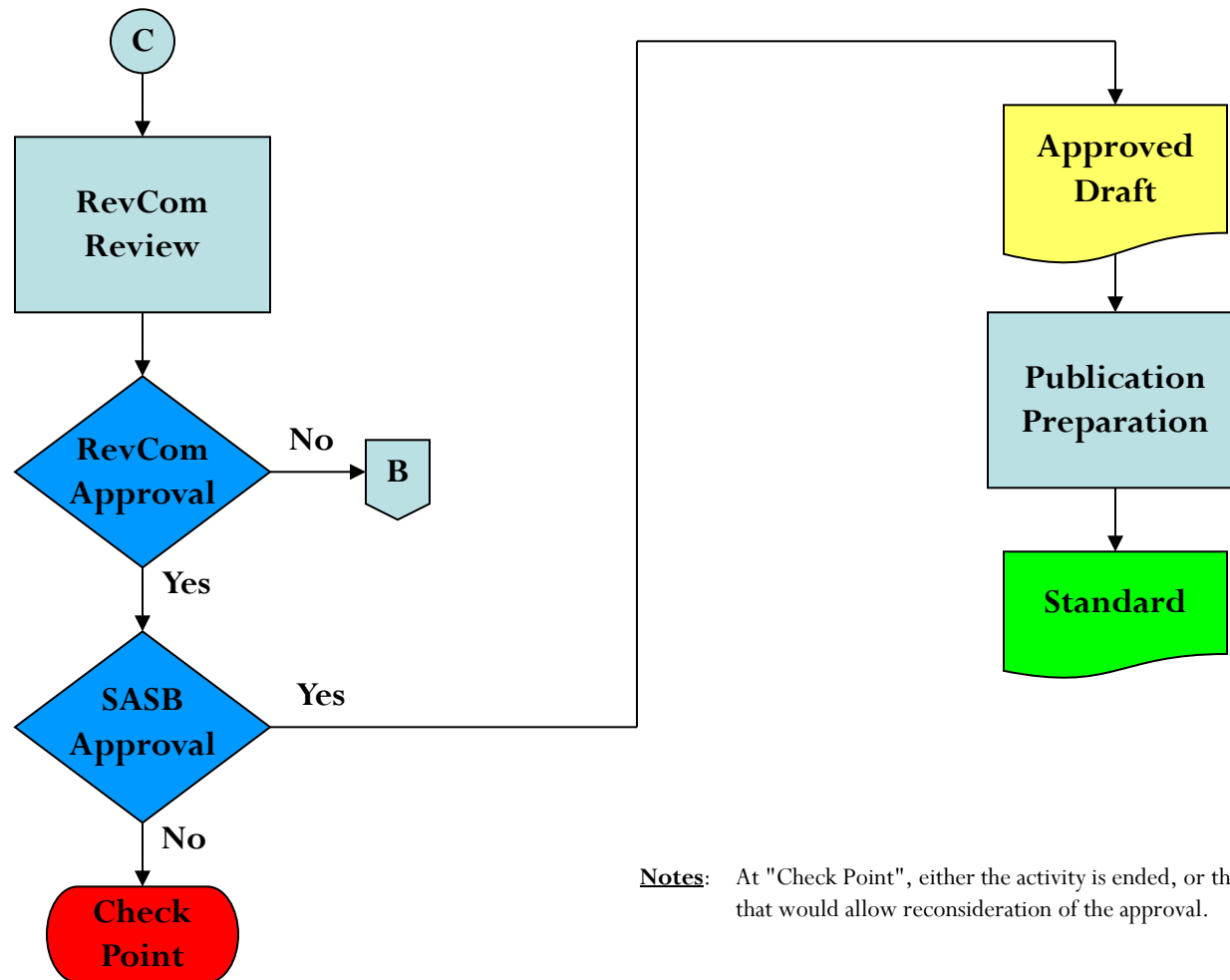
Overview of IEEE 802.3 Standards Process (4/5)- Sponsor Ballot Phase

Liaisons and Communications

Private Area

- What is posted to the private area?
 - Drafts of the standard
 - Any drafts from other SDOs that have been supplied to us
 - Login and password info is never posted on slides or in emails
 - Login and password should not be given out to anyone

Task Force Operation

- The Task Force writes the standard
- P802.3bp will be a two clauses to the 802.3 Standard, 97 and 98
- P802.3bp will modify existing clauses 1, 22, 30, 32, 33, 45 and 78
- Other clauses may also be modified

Action Items

- Comment resolution to D1.5
- Decide which comments to implement in D1.6 (requires redline at closing) or defer to WG ballot.
- Insure technical completeness
- Discuss timeline

Presentations

The Road to WG Ballot

- **July 2015**
 - It is best not to make changes to the preview draft during the plenary week
 - Request to go to WG ballot is made at the Thursday closing plenary
 - Any changes made during the week must be shown as a red-line to D2.0
 - Small changes are OK---half the pages in red strike-through are not
 - If a small number of comments are received in TF review, it is possible to ask commenters to withdraw them and resubmit at WG ballot

WG Ballot

- **July 2015**
 - If WG approves WG ballot, David Law will open the ballot after the July meeting for a 30-day review
- **September 2015**
 - WG casts approve or disapprove votes
 - Ballot must meet >50% return rate, >75% approval rate, <30% abstain rate
 - ER or TR comments are an automatic disapprove
 - ER and TR must be signed-off by the commenter in order to get their vote changed to approve
 - TF resolves are WG comments to D2.0 and creates D2.1 for WG 1st recirculation out of September
 - Any portion of D2.0 that received no comments is out-of-scope for D2.1
 - This is how we move to completion
- **November 2015**
 - Resolve comments to D2.1
