 - Comfortable venue conducive to TF & SG work
 - Competitive hotel guest room rates
 - Affordable meeting fees
 - Possible special event (schedule permitting)
- Meeting planning is ongoing
 - Meeting planner Lynn Kennedy, who is working now on arrangements for the Ethernet Alliance-hosted May 2015 Joint Interim (approved in July 2013), will source a venue for 2016 during the coming year



Hotel Highlights



ethernet alliance

- The meeting venue will comfortably accommodate 250-300 attendees, and the growing number of task forces/study groups
- Targeted guest room rate is \$159, not to exceed \$199
 - We strive to avoid additional fees, and include as many perks as possible in the group rate



Meeting Fees



ethernet alliance

- The early registration fee will not exceed \$350
 - The late registration fee, and fee for attendees who do not stay at the designated meeting hotel, will be higher
- The meeting fee, along with contributions from the Ethernet Alliance, will fund:
 - Meeting room rental
 - Continental breakfast and morning and afternoon breaks
 - AV support in all meeting rooms
 - Wireless network in all meeting rooms
 - Meeting planning and support

- We will identify a property in North America that offers the best accommodations for the group during the designated week.
- Possible destinations include:
 - Vancouver or other Pacific Northwest city
 - Long Beach or other Los Angeles area location
 - Denver
 - Additional “2nd tier” cities
- When evaluating locations we consider:
 - Accessibility
 - Ambience
 - Weather
 - Value
 - Locations of other scheduled meetings



Planning Process

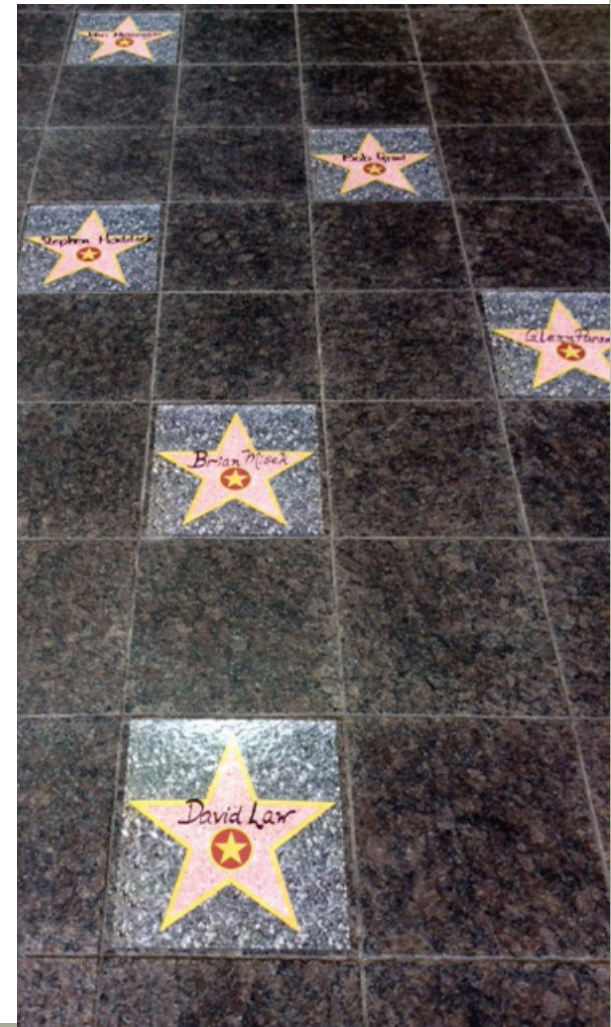
- Sourcing venues for 250+ attendees and multiple large meeting rooms is a significant undertaking
 - To request detailed proposals from properties that can accommodate the growing group, and provide the best value to attendees, we must have your agreement to participate this week
- Interim dates will be those requested by 802.3 leadership
 - We will seek destination approval from group leadership before finalizing contract with venue
- Meeting registration and hotel reservations for the May 2106 meeting will be open to attendees no later than March 2016, and we will strive to announce final details earlier
- Related note: Update on May 2015 Joint Interim
 - We announced Pittsburgh, PA, venue in September, and anticipate opening registration in January 2015
 - The Interim is scheduled the week of May 18th 2015
