### Scope

#### Procedure towards WG ballot

- Prepare draft for first ballot
  - 5.1.1: "The function of the Working Group is to produce a draft standard, recommended practice or guideline"
- Send out for first ballot by
  - motion at November 1994 plenary meeting:
     To submit draft 1 to the Executive committee for ballot by the Sponsor Balloting group

## Procedure towards Sponsor ballot

- Resolve negative votes and prepare next draft
- If result was affirmative: send new draft to ExCom for Sponsor Balloting Group ballot
- If result was not affirmative: send new draft out for confirmation ballot within WG

# Procedure towards IEEE Standards Board acceptance

- Resolve negative votes and prepare next draft
- If result was affirmative: send new draft to ExCom for submission to the IEEE Standards Board
- If result was not affirmative: send new draft out for confirmation ballot within Sponsor Balloting Group ballot

#### Ballot rules at WG level

- Requires 50 % return of ballots from voting members to make ballot valid
  - voting members have an obligation to vote
     5.1.3.3: "Membership may be lost if two of the last three Working Group letter ballots are not returned or returned with an abstention other than "lack of technical expertise"."
- 5.1.4.2.2: "The ballot shall contain three choices:
  - Approve. (May attach non-binding comments.)
  - Do Not Approve. (Must attach specific comments on what must be done to the draft to change the vote to "Approve".)
  - Abstain. (Must include reasons for abstention.)"

### Ballot rules at WG level (cont.)

- Requires 75 % approval by those voting to pass the ballot
  - Objective is to reach consensus
  - "Do Not Approve" votes of observers will also be considered
- Obtain Working Group approval
  - Resolve negative votes
  - 5.1.4.2.2: "Submission of a draft standard or a revised standard to the Executive Committee must be accompanied by any outstanding negative votes and a statement of why these unresolved negative votes could not be resolved"

#### Rules for Sponsor ballot groups

- Requires 75 % return to make ballot valid
  - Before actual ballot the sponsor ballot group will be assembled by inviting those that have shown interest in Sponsor Balloting Group for 802.11
  - Those that accept the invitation have committed to vote
- Requires 75 % approval by those voting to pass the ballot
  - Rejected "Do Not Approve" votes have to be presented to voter with reasons for rebuttal and a request to change vote into Approval

## Rules for sending proposal to IEEE Standards Board

- Propsal has to contain:
  - The Proposed Standard
  - The Ballot summary document
  - Copies of all unresolved negative votes, together with the reasons given by the negative voters and the rebuttals by the sponsor
  - Proof of Coordination
