# Proposed timing and order for comments / contributions

- Comments sorted according to page no
- Many comments on the same issue
  - Ask for a consolidated view during the meeting
    - If not possible, for the next meeting
- Work time for comment resolution:
  - Monday: 1 1/2 hours
  - Tuesday: 2 1/2 – morning, 4 1/2 afternoon, 3 evening
  - Thursday: 2 – morning, 4 1/2 afternoon
  - Total: 18 hours = 1080 min
  - **15min/contribution** =  $15 * 20 = 300 \text{min}$
  - 20sec/duplicate =  $20 * (1136 - 550) / 60 = 200 \text{min}$
  - $(1080 - 300 - 200) / 551 = \underline{\mathbf{1 \text{min} / \text{comment}}}$

# Working procedures

- Comment presentation
  - Max. 20sec.
    - If the commenter is present, speaks
    - If the commenter is not present, the comment is displayed
  - Comment resolution
    - If no opposition, and the comment has proposed text changes, is Approved
    - If no opposition, and the comment does not have proposed text
      - The comment is Approved-Modified
        - An A.I. is issued, if somebody takes the responsibility
        - Otherwise a note is inserted for need of text
