VANCOUVER INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT (YVR) TRANSPORTATION

Canada Line: The Canada Line connects Vancouver International Airport to downtown Vancouver in under 30 minutes. Cost is \$3.75 CAD for adults and \$2.50 CAD for children each way, plus a \$5.00 CAD surcharge for all trips originating at the airport. Hyatt Regency Vancouver is located at the **Burrard Street** station and will require a **transfer** at either <u>Granville Station or Waterfront Station</u>. Taxi: Taxis are available at the airport 24 hours a day, including wheelchair accessible vans. Taxi queue areas are located at both the domestic and international arrivals terminals. Approximate cost to the Hyatt: \$35.00 CAD

Language - English and French are Canada's two official languages. English is the predominant language in British Columbia. The cosmopolitan city of Vancouver encompasses a mix of many ethnic groups. Many key visitor locations have multilingual staff.

Climate - Vancouver has one of the mildest climates in Canada. Winters are wet but temperatures seldom fall below freezing and snow is rare.

Currency - Bank debit or credit cards are the most convenient means of getting cash at the many 24hour-access automated banking machines. All our taxis accept credit cards and 60% of our taxis are hybrid cars. As in the U.S. and Europe these machines accept cards with Plus, Interact and Cirrus symbols and there is one on almost every block in downtown Vancouver. Many Canadian businesses accept U.S. currency and travellers cheques.

International currency exchanges are available at the airport and at all the banks in the city. Major credit cards (VISA, MasterCard, American Express), are generally accepted by Canadian businesses. The U.S. dollar exchange rates vary daily.

Tipping - Some properties and resort hotels include tips or gratuities with tours group to simplify bookkeeping. This will usually include gratuities for housekeeping, bell service and food service. If meals are included in the price, customary gratuity will be calculated at 15 per cent. Visitors should be advised that the standard tip in most restaurants is 15 per cent.

Smoking Laws - Each municipality in Metro Vancouver has different rules for smoking in public places such as public buildings, restaurants and pubs.

Within the City of Vancouver, all indoor public spaces, including public transit, shopping malls, restaurants, pubs, nightclubs and casinos, do not permit smoking. Smoking is not permitted within six meters of an entryway, opening window or air intake of a building. Signage will be posted to indicate the applicable smoking restrictions. <u>Please smoke in designated areas only.</u>

Medical Insurance - Do you need Medical Insurance when you travel to Canada? Visitors are not covered by Canadian health insurance. Check with your personal medical plan before leaving the U.S. or your home country to ensure you have adequate travelling insurance. It is advised that all people travelling outside their own country take out trip cancellation insurance, medical insurance and insurance to cover loss/damage to personal effects.

Tips on using Cell Phones – Get a data and long distance plan before leaving home

Are you one of many of convention attendees traveling from the U.S. or internationally into Canada? Take Note: Roaming charges and data plan fees for cell phones (especially smart phones like the iPhone or the Android) and tablets like the iPad can be costly, with prices spiking as high as several dollars per minute

Before catching your flight to Canada, contact your local cell phone carrier to get information about special pricing plans for calls, text messaging and Internet usage outside your home country. If you use a smart phone, ask your carrier about certain settings such as "airplane mode" that may help you save money on usage.

Late/On-site: After 6pm Pacific Time January 4, 2013

(UTC Time: 2am Saturday, January 5, 2013)

- \$900 US for attendees staying at the Hyatt Regency Vancouver
- \$1200 US for all others (including local attendees not staying at the group hotel)

Student: Before 6pm Pacific Time, Thursday, January 17, 2013

(UTC Time: 2am Friday, January 17, 2013)

- \$150 US for Full-Time Students (college students at the bachelor or post-graduate level)

REGISTRATION POLICY:

Session Registration: Registration is available through a secure website and requires a valid credit card for the payment of the registration fee; checks are NOT accepted for registration.

Any individual who attends any part of a meeting that is a scheduled part of an 802 Wireless Interim Session must register for the full session.

Session registrations are not transferable to another individual or to another interim session.

If you register for an IEEE 802 Wireless Interim Session and then are unable to attend, you must request cancellation of your registration before the cancellation deadline to be eligible for a refund of all or part of the fees paid.

GROUP HOTEL DISCOUNT POLICY:

VISA LETTERS

A VISA may be required for entry into the Canada. For information regarding visas and entry requirements for Canada, please call Immigration Canada at 1-888-242-2100 (in Canada) or visit their website at www.cic.gc.ca. From outside Canada, please contact the nearest Canadian Embassy, High Commission, or consulate in your region (http://www.cic.gc.ca/english/information/offices/missions.asp). It is recommended that your passport be valid for at 6 months following your arrival date and that you are able to document means for return or onward travel.

For those registered attendees who require a VISA to enter the Canada a <u>Letter of Invitation may be</u> generated after registration has been completed. To obtain a VISA Invitation Letter, click on the <u>VISA</u> <u>Letter</u> tab on the drop down menu under the Register tab.
