4 Approval of the meeting minutes from the last meeting

The 802.3br March Macau meeting minutes document (see http://www.ieee802.org/3/br/public/2016-03%20Macau_plenary/8023-IET-TF-Meeting-Minutes-20160316 rev1.pdf) was approved unanimously (approved by voice with no opposition).

5 Status of IEEE 802.3br project

The 1st Sponsor recirculation ballot on the amendment IEEE P802.3br Interspersing Express Traffic closed successfully on 30th April 2016. The ballot exceeded the required 75% for consensus to approve the draft. Since no comments were received the additional IEEE P802.3br interim meeting planned for 3rd May in Karlsruhe, Germany was cancelled.

The ballot statistics are:

143 Voters

106 Approve

2 Disapprove

11 Abstain

119 Ballots returned

83.22% Response Rate (>= 75% required)

9.24% Abstain Rate (< 30% required)

98.15% Approval Rate (>= 75% required)

The last paragraph of Clause 12 'Procedure for Conditional Approval to Forward a Draft Standard' states that 'Submissions may be forwarded to RevCom without Sponsor Approval or Conditional Approval in order to meet the submittal requirements for the next RevCom meeting, provided that the Sponsor Chair first notifies the Sponsor email reflector that, in the Sponsor Chair's view based on the complete RevCom package, there is a reasonable expectation that the submittal will be approved by the Sponsor before the RevCom meeting. If it becomes apparent that approval will not be completed, the submittal shall be withdrawn from the RevCom agenda as early as possible'.

This process was followed and the draft has been pre-submitted to RevCom.

Tony Jeffree was informed by David Law at Th 05.05.2016 19:29CEST about the status of the IEEE 802.3br, so that they can align the time-line of the dependent IEEE 802.1Qbu document for approval of RevCom.
