

INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE WG CHAIR

The IEEE SA strongly recommends that at each WG meeting the chair or a designee:

Show slides 1 through 4 of this presentation

• Advise the WG attendees that:

Additionally, neither IEEE, the WG, nor the WG Chair can ensure the accuracy or completeness of any assurance or whether any such assurance is, in fact, of a Patent Claim that is essential for the use of the standard under development.

Instruct the WG Secretary to record in the minutes of the relevant WG meeting:

- That the foregoing information was provided and that slides 1 through 4 (and this slide 0, if applicable) were shown;
- That the chair or designee provided an opportunity for participants to identify patent claim(s)/patent application claim(s) and/or the holder of patent claim(s)/patent application claim(s) of which the participant is personally aware and that may be essential for the use of that standard
- Any responses that were given, specifically the patent claim(s)/patent application claim(s) and/or the holder of the patent claim(s)/patent application claim(s) that were identified (if any) and by whom.
- The WG Chair shall ensure that a request is made to any identified holders of potential essential patent claim(s) to complete and submit a Letter of Assurance.
- It is recommended that the WG Chair review the guidance in *IEEE SA Standards Board Operations Manual* 6.3.5 and in FAQs 14 and 15 on inclusion of potential Essential Patent Claims by incorporation or by reference.

Note: **WG** includes Working Groups, Task Groups, and other standards-developing committees with a PAR approved by the IEEE SA Standards Board.

OTHER GUIDELINES FOR IEEE WORKING GROUP MEETINGS

All IEEE SA standards meetings shall be conducted in compliance with all applicable laws, including antitrust and competition laws.

Don't discuss or engage in the fixing of product prices, allocation of customers, or division of sales markets.

Don't discuss the status or substance of ongoing or threatened litigation.

Don't be silent if inappropriate topics are discussed. Formally object to the discussion immediately.




- The <u>IEEE-SA Standards Board Bylaws</u> (clause 5.2.1.3) specifies that "the standards development process shall not be dominated by any single interest category, individual, or organization"
 - This means no participant may exercise "authority, leadership, or influence by reason of superior leverage, strength, or representation to the exclusion of fair and equitable consideration of other viewpoints" or "to hinder the progress of the standards development activity"
- This rule applies equally to those participating in a standards development project and to that project's leadership group
- Any person who reasonably suspects that dominance is occurring in a standards development project is encouraged to bring the issue to the attention of the Standards Committee or the project's IEEE-SA Program Manager

Overview of IEEE 802.3 Standards Process (1/5)-Study Group Phase






Overview of IEEE 802.3 Standards Process (3/5) – Working Group Ballot Phase


Overview of IEEE 802.3 Standards Process (4/5)-IEEE Standards Association (SA) Ballot Phase

IEEE P802.3dk Greater than 50 Gb/s BiDi Optical Access PHYs Task Force Objectives

- Support full-duplex operation only
- Support bidirectional transmission over a single strand of single mode fiber
- Support MAC data rates of 100 Gb/s and 200 Gb/s
- For each data rate define PHYs for operation up to at least 10 km
- For each data rate define PHYs for operation up to at least 20 km
- For each data rate define PHYs for operation up to at least 40 km
- Preserve the Ethernet frame format utilizing the Ethernet MAC
- For 100 Gb/s operation, support a BER of better than or equal to 10⁻¹² at the MAC/PLS service interface (or the frame loss ratio equivalent)
- For 200 Gb/s operation, support a BER of better than or equal to 10⁻¹³ at the MAC/PLS service interface (or the frame loss ratio equivalent)
- Support optional Energy-Efficient Ethernet operation
- Support silent start* operation to prevent bidirectional PHYs interfering with P2MP networks

* Silent start means that the upstream-facing PHY does not transmit unless a valid downstream signal is received. This prevents the bidirectional PHY from jamming transmission on the P2MP network in cases of unintentional connection
