According to the IEEE 802.3af/-2003 the Ethernet interface should be able to delivery up to 15.4W per port. What is the interpretation that the standard specifies in the following two scenarios:

- 1. Does a switch that is able to deliver 15.4W per port on any port BUT not simultaneously on all ports can be considered to comply with the standard?
- 2. Is it mandatory that all the ports in a IEEE 802.3af/-2003 compliant switch delivery simultaneously the 15.4W per ports or does the standard does not specify that aspect?
