Guidelines for IEEE-SA Meetings

- All IEEE-SA standards meetings shall be conducted in compliance with all applicable laws, including antitrust and competition laws.
 - Don't discuss the interpretation, validity, or essentiality of patents/patent claims.
 - Don't discuss specific license rates, terms, or conditions.
 - Relative costs of different technical approaches that include relative costs of patent licensing terms may be discussed in standards development meetings.
 - Technical considerations remain the primary focus
 - Don't discuss or engage in the fixing of product prices, allocation of customers, or division of sales markets.
 - Don't discuss the status or substance of ongoing or threatened litigation.
 - Don't be silent if inappropriate topics are discussed ... do formally object.

Participant behavior in IEEE-SA activities is guided by the IEEE Codes of Ethics & Conduct

- All participants in IEEE-SA activities are expected to adhere to the core principles underlying the:
 - [IEEE Code of Ethics](#)
 - [IEEE Code of Conduct](#)
- The core principles of the IEEE Codes of Ethics & Conduct are to:
 - *Uphold the highest standards of integrity, responsible behavior, and ethical and professional conduct*
 - *Treat people fairly and with respect, to not engage in harassment, discrimination, or retaliation, and to protect people's privacy.*
 - *Avoid injuring others, their property, reputation, or employment by false or malicious action*

Participants in the IEEE-SA “*individual process*” shall act independently of others, including employers

- The [IEEE-SA Standards Board Bylaws](#) require that “*participants in the IEEE standards development individual process shall act based on their qualifications and experience*”
- This means participants:
 - **Shall act & vote** based on their personal & independent opinions derived from their expertise, knowledge, and qualifications
 - **Shall not act or vote** based on any obligation to or any direction from any other person or organization, including an employer or client, regardless of any external commitments, agreements, contracts, or orders
 - **Shall not direct** the actions or votes of other participants or retaliate against other participants for fulfilling their responsibility to act & vote based on their personal & independently developed opinions
- By participating in standards activities using the “*individual process*”, you are deemed to accept these requirements; if you are unable to satisfy these requirements then you shall immediately cease any participation

IEEE-SA standards activities shall allow the fair & equitable consideration of all viewpoints

- The [IEEE-SA Standards Board Bylaws](#) (clause 5.2.1.3) specifies that “*the standards development process shall not be dominated by any single interest category, individual, or organization*”
 - This means no participant may exercise “*authority, leadership, or influence by reason of superior leverage, strength, or representation to the exclusion of fair and equitable consideration of other viewpoints*” or “*to hinder the progress of the standards development activity*”
- This rule applies equally to those participating in a standards development project and to that project’s leadership group
- Any person who reasonably suspects that dominance is occurring in a standards development project is encouraged to bring the issue to the attention of the Standards Committee or the project’s IEEE-SA Program Manager

Maintenance request 1344

- Proposes to change 99.4.6 as follows
... the Express filter ~~passes the RS PLS_DATA.request~~issues ePLS_DATA.indications
to the eMAC ...
- The actual issue seems to be that “RS PLS_DATA.request” should be “RS PLS_DATA.indication”
- The proposed text loses the fact that ePLS_DATA.indication convey values received via RS PLS_DATA.indication
- In scope: Yes/~~No~~
- Errata: Yes/~~No~~
- Complete: Yes/~~No~~
- Ask the submitter to consider updating the request to only change “RS PLS_DATA.request” to “RS PLS_DATA.indication”

Maintenance request 1348

- In 97.3.8, change “in-band” to “out-of-band” to match the description of OAM information in 97.1.2
- In scope: Yes/~~No~~
- Errata: ~~Yes~~/No
- Complete: Yes/~~No~~
- Change status to “Ready for ballot”.

Maintenance request 1349

- OAM option defined in 97.3.8 lacks normative behaviors and associated PICS
- Add “When OAM is implemented, behavior shall conform to the state diagrams in Figure 97-17 and Figure 97-18.”
- Add new major capability and items to the PICS.
- In scope: Yes/~~No~~
- Errata: ~~Yes~~/No
- Complete: Yes/~~No~~
- Change status to “Ready for ballot”.

Maintenance request 1350

- In the frontmatter (Introduction) it states:

Ethernet at 10 Mb/s was approved as an IEEE standard by the IEEE Standards Board in 1983 and subsequently published in 1985 as IEEE Std 802.3-1985.

- But the title of the document was:

Local Area Networks: Carrier sense multiple access with collision detection (CSMA/CD) access method and physical layer specifications

- The title was changed to “Standard for Ethernet” in the 2012 revision
- Update the introduction accordingly
- In scope: Yes/~~No~~
- Errata: ~~Yes~~/No
- Complete: Yes/~~No~~
- Status to remain “received” until WG chair prepares frontmatter for next IEEE 802.3 revision and it is incorporated into the draft
