



The IEEE SA strongly recommends that at each WG meeting the chair or a designee:

- Instruct the WG Secretary to record in the minutes of the relevant WG meeting:
 - That the foregoing information was provided and that slides 1 through 4 (and this slide 0, if applicable) were shown;
 - That the chair or designee provided an opportunity for participants to identify patent claim(s)/patent application claim(s) and/or the holder of patent claim(s)/patent application claim(s) of which the participant is personally aware and that may be essential for the use of that standard
 - Any responses that were given, specifically the patent claim(s)/patent application claim(s) and/or the holder of the patent claim(s)/patent application claim(s) that were identified (if any) and by whom.
- The WG Chair shall ensure that a request is made to any identified holders of potential essential patent claim(s) to complete and submit a Letter of Assurance.
- It is recommended that the WG Chair review the guidance in *IEEE SA Standards Board Operations Manual* 6.3.5 and in FAQs 14 and 15 on inclusion of potential Essential Patent Claims by incorporation or by reference.

Note: **WG** includes Working Groups, Task Groups, and other standards-developing committees with a PAR approved by the IEEE SA Standards Board.





PARTICIPANTS HAVE A DUTY TO INFORM THE IEEE

- Participants <u>shall</u> inform the IEEE (or cause the IEEE to be informed) of the identity of each holder of any potential Essential Patent Claims of which they are personally aware if the claims are owned or controlled by the participant or the entity the participant is from, employed by, or otherwise represents
- Participants <u>should</u> inform the IEEE (or cause the IEEE to be informed)
 of the identity of any other holders of potential Essential Patent Claims

Early identification of holders of potential Essential Patent Claims is encouraged





WAYS TO INFORM IEEE

- Cause an LOA to be submitted to the IEEE SA (patcom@ieee.org); or
- Provide the chair of this group with the identity of the holder(s) of any and all such claims as soon as possible; or
- Speak up now and respond to this Call for Potentially Essential Patents

If anyone in this meeting is personally aware of the holder of any patent claims that are potentially essential to implementation of the proposed standard(s) under consideration by this group and that are not already the subject of an Accepted Letter of Assurance, please respond at this time by providing relevant information to the WG Chair





OTHER GUIDELINES FOR IEEE WORKING GROUP MEETINGS

- All IEEE SA standards meetings shall be conducted in compliance with all applicable laws, including antitrust and competition laws.
 - *Don't discuss the interpretation, validity, or essentiality of patents/patent claims.

 - Relative costs of different technical approaches that include relative costs of patent licensing terms may be discussed in standards development meetings.
 - •Technical considerations remain the primary focus.
 - Don't discuss or engage in the fixing of product prices, allocation of customers, or division of sales markets.
 - Don't discuss the status or substance of ongoing or threatened litigation.
 - Don't be silent if inappropriate topics are discussed. Formally object to the discussion immediately.

 - Shall not direct the actions or votes of other participants or retaliate against other participants for fulfilling their responsibility to act & vote based on their personal & independently developed opinions
- By participating in standards activities using the "individual process", you are deemed to accept these requirements; if you are unable to satisfy these requirements then you shall immediately cease any participation

IEEE-SA standards activities shall allow the fair & equitable consideration of all viewpoints

- The <u>IEEE-SA Standards Board Bylaws</u> (clause 5.2.1.3) specifies that "the standards development process shall not be dominated by any single interest category, individual, or organization"
 - This means no participant may exercise "authority, leadership, or influence by reason of superior leverage, strength, or representation to the exclusion of fair and equitable consideration of other viewpoints" or "to hinder the progress of the standards development activity"
- This rule applies equally to those participating in a standards development project and to that project's leadership group
- Any person who reasonably suspects that dominance is occurring in a standards development project is encouraged to bring the issue to the attention of the Standards Committee or the project's IEEE-SA Program Manager

 - Would result in 'ITU-T Recommendation Y.nnn Standard for Ethernet

 - Incorporation of IEEE Std 802.3 by reference in whole
 - Discussion at IEEE 802/ITU standing committee (16:00 18:00 Wednesday)
 - Potentially two contributions with cover liaison letter
 - A.1 justification for new work item (NWI) and draft of Y.nnn Standard for Ethernet

IEEE 802 LAN/MAN Standards Committee report Treasury

IEEE 802 LAN/MAN Standards Committee report Proposed Change for Attendance

- Return to requiring In-Person attendance at 2 out of the last 4 Plenary Sessions
 - One In-Person Interim may be used in place of a plenary
 - Require In-Person attendance at 1 1/2 meetings per year (or 2 one year, one the alternate)
- This policy only affects gaining and maintaining voting rights
 - IEEE 802 is planning to continue with hybrid meetings
 - Anyone complies with the meeting fee rules can participate
- The WG chair can declare In-Person attendance credit at their discretion

IEEE 802 LAN/MAN Standards Committee report Why Is This Change Being Considered

- To encourage in-person attendance
 - Encourage informal consensus building
 - Build empathy among individuals
 - Encourage active participation among attendees
- Provide individuals with a strong reason to justify travel time and cost for in-person attendance
 - Travel costs are only a small part of the overall commitment
 - Time is probably our most valuable contribution
- Improve unity and cross-pollination of ideas among IEEE 802 standards and attendees

IEEE 802 LAN/MAN Standards Committee report Proposed Change for Attendance: FAQ

- When will it take effect?
 - 2 options being considered, one is after March 2024 plenary, the other is after the July 2024 plenary
- When will I start to lose voting rights if I don't attend in person?
 - It depends on your previous credited attendance
 - If it takes effect at the end of the March 2024 meeting, it could be until May 2025
 - If it takes effect at the end of the July 2024 meeting, it could be until September 2025

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
