SUMMARY REPORT OF THE NOVEMBER 2005 MEETING OF IEEE 802.11:

Our November 2005 meeting was held at the Hyatt Regency Vancouver, Vancouver, BC, Canada. As of this meeting, the 802.11 membership consists of 513 voting members.

These **Ballots** were initiated in the weeks preceding this meeting:

- Letter Ballot 78 of P802.11k-D3.0 was conducted October 3rd to November 12th, 2005. It passed with 295 approve, 75 disapprove, and 33 abstain, a 80% approval. There was an 78% return rate.
- Sponsor Ballot of P802.11REV-ma-D5.0 runs from October 21 through November 20, 2005.

New Ballots:

• The working group approved conducting a working group letter ballot on P802.11r-D1.0, which will conclude before the January interim meeting.

Other WG activities:

- 802.11e was published by the IEEE Standards Board on November 11, 2005.
 Awards were presented to 802.11e contributors during the 802.11 plenary session on Monday.
- The working group passed a motion to recommend the withdrawal of IEEE Trial Use Recommended Practice 802.11F and requests the LMSC Executive Committee to forward the withdrawal request to the IEEE-SA Standards Board.
- The PAR and Five Criteria for 802.11Y (Contention Based Protocols) were approved by ExCom.
- The ISO/IEC JTC1/SC6 study group, which deals with the WAPI fast track ballot in ISO, was extended until March 2006.
- Upcoming **Interim** meeting locations were discussed:
 - January 15 20, 2006: Hilton Waikoloa Village, Kona, Hawaii (Big Island). Registration at the reduced rate ends on November 1, 2005.
 - May 14 19, 2006: Hyatt Regency in Jacksonville, FL.
 - September 2006 is currently undecided. Potential locations are Brisbane or Melbourne, Australia, Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia, Thailand, and India. There was a straw poll between Melbourne and India—Melbourne was the majority preference.
